



Report Guidance

To access your child's report, please log into Arbor via [the website](#) or the app.

Your child's report will provide you with key information in four areas:

- Attainment
- Attitude to Learning
- Attendance
- Behaviour

We will be sharing this information with you four times across the academic year and ask that you take the time to read through it. As is laid out in the diagram at the end of this document, we strongly encourage you to discuss the different sections with your child, celebrate their achievement, and challenge them on the areas where you feel they could be performing better. As a school community, it is this process of support – focused on the student – that allows us to ensure that all our learners have the best opportunity to achieve their full potential.

Attainment

Student Target – The grade your child should **strive to achieve** by the end of year 11. This is based on our belief that all students have the potential to achieve academic success (a minimum of a grade 5). Teachers will raise this target in line with your child's ability.

Predicted Grade – The grade your child is **predicted to gain** at the end of year 11. This is based on their most recent assessment data, their teacher's professional judgement as to their likely progression between now and the end of year 11, and the continuation of their current attitude to learning.

Attitude to Learning (ATL)

Number descriptors:

- 5 – Consistently works hard and has an outstanding attitude to learning. Homework is completed to a high standard and is always handed in on time.
- 4 – Usually works hard and has a positive attitude to learning. Homework is usually completed to a high standard.
- 3 – Sometimes works hard but has an inconsistent attitude to learning. Homework is sometimes completed.
- 2 – Rarely works hard and has a poor attitude to learning. Homework is rarely completed.
- 1 – Been absent for long periods so difficult to judge attitude to learning.

Reading Age

Your child's reading age can be found at the bottom of the report. Students with a reading age below their chronological reading age will receive interventions to support them, where appropriate.

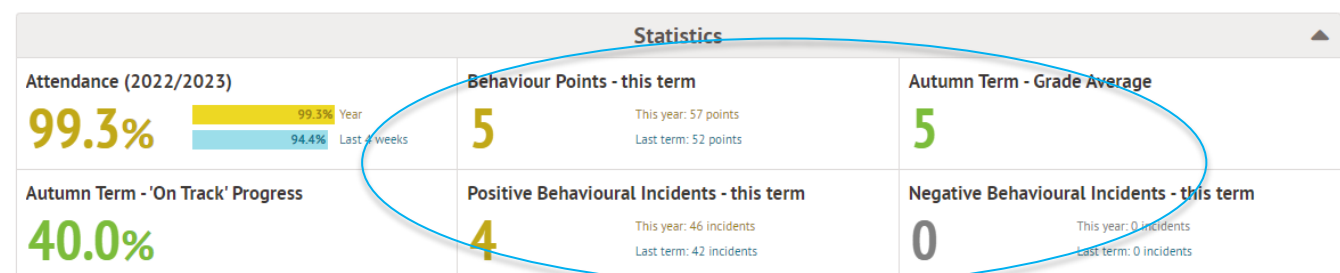
Behaviour

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Behaviour points reflect the positive points your child has achieved to date.

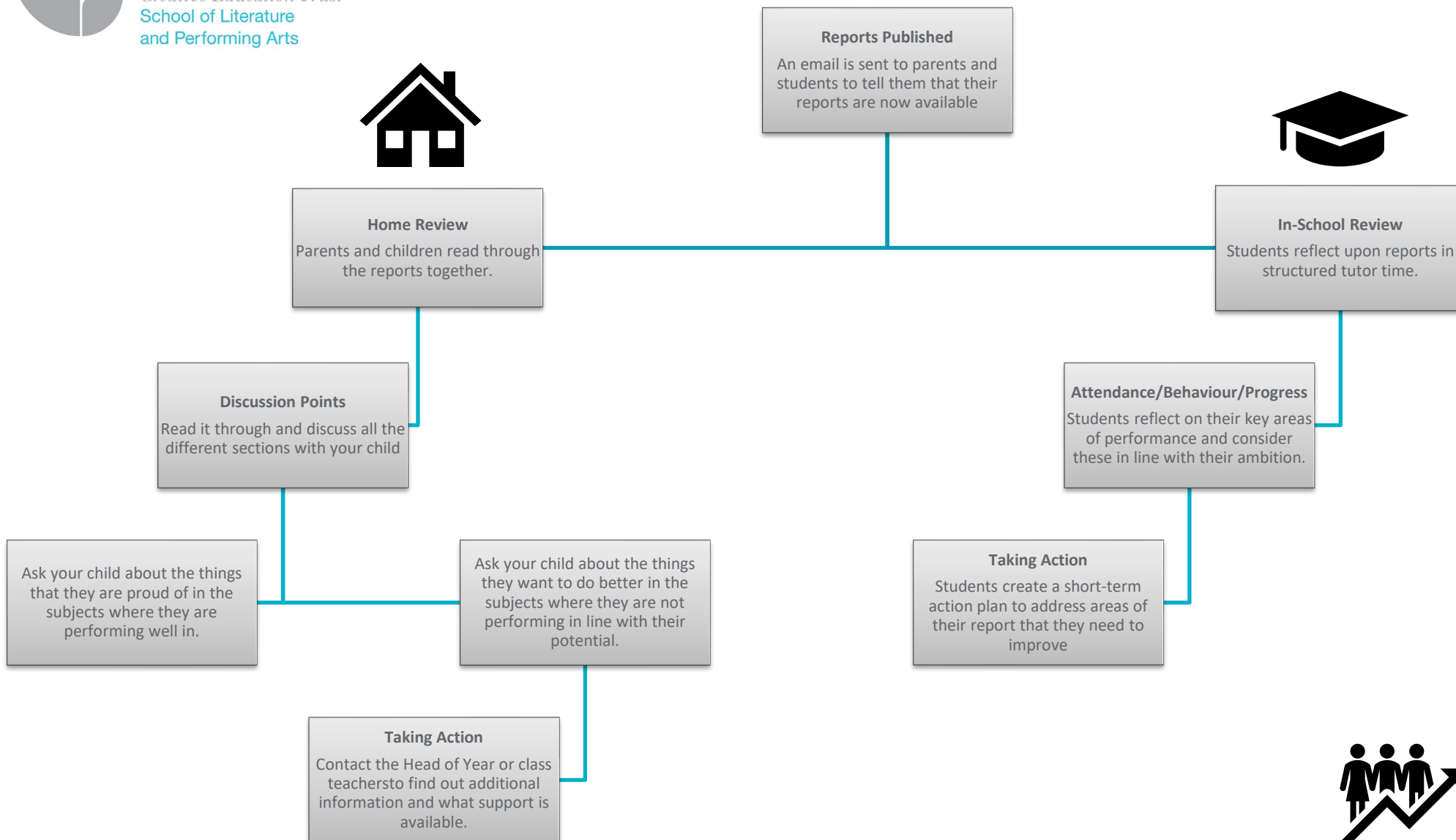

A Quick Guide to your Child's Achievement Report

Attendance percentages:

- 100% - Excellent
- >97% - School Target
- <96% - Below expectations; it is likely that low attendance is having a negative impact on attainment
- <90% - Registered as Persistent Absence by the Department for Education; this is a serious concern


Behaviour:

Positive and negative incidents reflects the amount of events that have been recorded for your child.


This does not reflect the level of severity of incident.

Reading Age:

Your child's reading age measure in years and months.
E.g. 14:03 = 14 years and 3 months

Attitude to Learning Descriptors

Attitude to Learning (ATL)

Number descriptors:

1. Been absent for long periods so difficult to judge attitude to learning.
2. Rarely works hard and has a poor attitude to learning. Homework is rarely completed.
3. Sometimes works hard but has an inconsistent attitude to learning. Homework is sometimes completed.
4. Usually works hard and has a positive attitude to learning. Homework is usually completed to a high standard.
5. Consistently works hard and has an outstanding attitude to learning. Homework is completed to a high standard and is always handed in on time.

Behaviour:

Behaviour points is the total number of positive points achieved by your child for their efforts across school. These may be awarded for ambition, achievement, character or contribution to community.

Attainment:

Student Target – The grade your child should strive to achieve by the end of year 11 (minimum of a grade 5).

Predicted Grade – The grade your child is predicted to gain at the end of year 11.

Attitude to learning:

The scale used to monitor your child's effort in lessons and home learning. Descriptors can be found on the reverse of the report.
