## **Personal Development**

## Safeguarding

During the Autumn term students have been focusing on our theme of Celebrating Diversity & Tolerance across the personal learning and PSHE curriculum. This has included key learning around subject matter such as combating extremism, terrorism, radicalisation and exploring LGBTQ+ and transphobia.

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As a school we recognise the importance of educating our community to identify contributing factors linked to child criminal exploitation (CCE). We have commissioned the Joe Dix Foundation to deliver bespoke workshops as part of our personal learning offer next term. The sessions will be using the Joe Dix story to develop our student's awareness of child criminal exploitation, gang violence and knife crime in the UK. ## **Student Leadership**

## Inclusion Framework

Our inclusion framework promotes personal development by providing a clear framework, using a graduated approach; to identify, support and review the progress of our most vulnerable learners at Caister Academy.

We are currently beginning the first cycle of passport creation for new students, along with a review of existing passports. In order to support your child's progress and any additional needs, the Inclusion Team will be regularly monitoring their progress and ensuring reasonable adjustments are in place to support learning and development.

Students with a passport have been allocated a member of school staff as a mentor. In most cases the mentor will be a form tutor or subject assistant who should communicate with you this term and should, alongside your child's Head of Year, be your key contact to discuss SEND.

# The Papillion Project

This September saw one full calendar year since the initial clearing of the ground that became the school community garden, and it is now well on its way to becoming a hub of cross-curricular activity.



Throughout this half term there has been a continuation of developments within the grounds, harvests have continued to be prolific and while much of the produce was utilised in catering lessons, the vast majority has been donated to the local community. This included a large donation for this year's harvest festival at Caister Trinity Church. The days may already be drawing in, but that hasn't stopped the team preparing for next year by planting hardy vegetables both outside and within the polytunnel. We greatly look forward to the coming growing season.

## **Educational Updates**

In line with the fantastic results achieved by Senior Year in the summer, we continue to drive academic achievement for every student, giving them every opportunity to excel. This half term we have really focused on the review phase of lessons, ensuring that students can consider how successful they have been in the lesson and – most crucially – that they know how to improve their learning, where needed. This has aligned nicely with celebrating students' achievement at the end of every lesson, whereby teachers identify up to three students to receive a 'Caister Coin' and give clear explanations as to how the recipients' learning and attitude resulted in the coin being awarded. We are incredibly proud of students' achievements and know that this desire to be successful and 'excel' will continue with all.

Running alongside excellent lessons is our 'gold standard' curriculum provision. We are committed to giving our students every opportunity to see how what they are learning in lessons links to reallife contexts, and our extensive trips and visits programme directly aligns with this. All curriculum leaders have identified out-of-school opportunities – across all year groups – that enrich students' understanding of the subject. One trip of note this half term, amongst many, was the Year 10 visit to Lloyds of London and Lockton Companies Ltd, followed by a performance of *The Taming of the Shrew* at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre. Students were able to immerse themselves in the London business world and gain an insight into a range of interesting and varied career opportunities. As the year progresses there will be many more opportunities for our students to experience the curriculum in varied and wonderful settings.

Part of the 'gold standard' curriculum offer we have, is to continue to teach the curriculum right up until the end of each term. For this reason, please do continue to book holidays outside of school term time, to enable your child to receive the very best education.

## **Independent Study & Student Planners**

Independent study is issued in line with the schedule and students have made a fantastic start to this important aspect of independent learning. A significant number of positive points have been awarded for quality of homework, effort, and completion. In total, 3129 independent study reward points have been issued this term. Thank you to all parents who support our learners in completing these tasks. Students should refer to Arbor as the main place for managing the completion of independent study, however they should also record key deadlines in their student planner. This acts as a single point for students to organise themselves.



# Library and Reading

The school library, newly renovated and better than ever, has quickly become a vibrant hub of activity throughout the academic year. With refreshed spaces and an inviting atmosphere, the library has started this term with a flurry of events. We have recently appointed 10 dedicated student librarians who are actively engaged in updating and revamping our collection of reading books, ensuring that students have access to an exciting and diverse range of titles. The library serves as more than just a place for study; it's a welcoming space that encourages a love of reading for pleasure as well as independent study. Students are regularly invited to explore new books, share recommendations, and dive into the joy of reading beyond their academic requirements.

In our continued effort to foster a culture of reading, we place great importance on creating fun and engaging experiences around books. This week, the library is hosting a Halloween-themed event, complete with a spooky short story contest, book-themed games, and a lunchtime reward for students who have excelled in reading this half term. These activities not only promote literacy but also help students discover the excitement that comes with reading for enjoyment. We believe that by encouraging reading in a positive and stimulating environment, we can cultivate lifelong readers and learners.

## Curriculum

We are extremely proud of our Year 10 students as they begin their options courses. Some subjects will feel familiar as it will have been studied in key stage three, other subjects like photography, health and social care, and graphics are completely new. This quote, from a teacher of an options course, sums up how Caister Academy students have approached their studies. *"The way students have adapted to their new courses has been amazing – students are demonstrating a real determination and excitement to begin learning new knowledge and skills!"* 

## Assessment

Assessment cycles have begun in all subject areas and student reports will be issued on Thursday 24 October and Friday 25 October. Please go through your report with your child, looking for areas of success, as well as development.

Year 7 started their assessment journey brilliantly by completing baseline tests in English, mathematics, and science which has enabled us to check that students are in the right sets and receive the appropriate support.

Next half term, our Senior Year will sit mock examinations. Please see the mock examination timetable <u>here</u>. Examinations begin on Monday 11 November 2024 and finish on Friday 22 November 2024. The timetable will mimic a normal summer examination day, so we expect students to arrive at the dining hall at 8.00am for registration and subject-specific warm-ups. Afternoon examinations begin at 1.30pm and the duration will take the academy day beyond 3.00pm. Students will receive personalised examination timetables – please check carefully for any late finishes to exams.



## **Senior Year**

Senior Year have made a phenomenal start to their afterschool *Step Up* programme, with an average of 60 students in attendance each evening. Students have taken up every opportunity to excel their outcomes as we move into the mock season. Senior Year have had a variety of external providers in to provide information and guidance on further education and students have begun their applications for FE. The deadline for submitting applications is Christmas.
