Top tips for revision:

1. Break revision into short bursts, 25 minutes revision then break.
2. Active revision (doing something with the revision) is most beneficial e.g. flash cards, mind maps or teaching the topic to someone else.
3. Focus on understanding not memorising.
4. Space out your revision (revising the same topic multiple times over weeks is far more effective than cramming).
5. Removing distractions (when revising remove distractions that could prevent effective revision).

## Mathematics Revision for Senior Year

Before Christmas, all students received a masterclass on mathematics revision by their teachers. This revision includes using specialised parts of SPARX mathematics to access bespoke revision, unique to them. To revise for mathematics, students need to complete questions within the revision platform on SPARX, supported by their unique revision guide - issued to them to support with answering questions. Furthermore, students can access their previously completed assessment results for previous mocks and fix up incorrect questions - directly closing gaps on inaccuracies from the last cycle. Please encourage your child/children to be engaging with this at home on a regular basis, to help them put their best foot forward in a critical subject.
